MOTORSPORT AUSTRALIA SCCSA 2024 SOUTH AUSTRALIAN HILLCLIMB CHAMPIONSHIP

COLLINGROVE 11th – 13th October 2024

1. AUTHORITY

Conducted under the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices, the National Competition Rules (NCR) of Motorsport Australia, the Motorsport Australia Manual, the Hillclimb Standing Regulations, the Motorsport Australia SCCSA 2024 South Australian Hill Climb Championship Supplementary Regulations and any further Regulations or Bulletins that may be issued.

The Event will be conducted under and in accordance with Motorsport Australia OH&S, Safety 1st, Integrity and Legal, and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the Motorsport Australia website at www.motorsport.org.au.

Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by Motorsport Australia in relation to the Event. Further details can be found in the Motorsport Australia Insurance Handbook, available at www.motorsport.org.au.

2. EVENT STANDING AND VENUE

This Event is **The Motorsport Australia SCCSA 2024 South Australian Hill Climb Championship** and is a **State Championship Event**.

The Event will be held at Collingrove Hillclimb, 71 Hill Climb Road, Mt McKenzie SA 5353 (8kms from Angaston on the Eden Valley Road). The Hillclimb is a bitumen sealed surface course, approximately 685 metres long and 3.3 metres wide. The return road is sealed. Catering is available. Limited camping facilities are available.

5. COMPETITOR ELIGIBILITY

Competitors must be financial members of a Motorsport Australia affiliated Car Club. Competitors must hold a current Motorsport Australia Speed/Speed Junior Licence or higher.

6. ELIGIBILITY OF VEHICLES

Please refer to the 2024 Motorsport Australia Manual (motorsport.org.au), Speed Event Appendix – National Speed event Championship Classes – Including Technical Regulations for Road Car and Limited Modified Road Car Classes.

For the purpose of safety, all vehicles will comply with General Requirements for Cars and Drivers, Schedule A and B of the Motorsport Australia Manual.

For the purpose of records, all vehicles will compete in classes as laid out in item 31 – Classes. Any records set at the Motorsport Australia SCCSA 2024 South Australian Hillclimb Championship will only apply to the class as run at this Event.

All vehicles must display the Motorsport Australia logo.

All vehicles must display a competition number, minimum 90mm high in a position visible when viewed from the right hand side of the vehicle.

7. ENTRIES

Entries open with the publication of these Supplementary Regulations. Entries must be made using Motorsport Australia Event Entry (www.motorsport.org.au) with payment to the Sporting Car Club of South Australia, 51 King William Road, Unley.

All entries received at the Sporting Car Club before the closing date of **4:00pm on Sunday 29TH September 2024** will pay an entry fee of **\$225.00** for SCCSA Members or **\$260.00** for Non SCCSA members. Entry for Friday private practice is **\$80.00** per competitor practicing.

Please note all Entry Fees are GST inclusive.

The entry fee will not be refundable except:

- a. In case of the abandonment of the Event.
- b. Where the entry is withdrawn by written advice to the Secretary of the Event by the seventh day prior to the Event/meeting commencing.
- c. Where an entry is refused.

Entries will be limited to **150** and shall be accepted in order of A) submission of Registration of Intent B) Completion and Receipt of Required Documentation C) Sporting Car Club Membership.

Late entries may be accepted in exceptional circumstances as determined by the organisers. Any late entries will attract a late payment fee of \$50.00.

Entries may be refused in accordance with the NCR.

The following multiple entries are permitted – multiple cars and multiple drivers at the sole discretion of the Organisers. These entries must be entered separately via www.motorsport.org.au/login with each being subject to individual entry fee.

Vehicles may only be entered in one Class and one Category and cannot be transferred without the Steward's permission once the competition has commenced. Multiple entries will be separated by at least five minutes between their runs.

ALL COMPETING CARS (other than those that are currently Road Registered) MUST HAVE CURRENT LOG BOOKS AS PER the NCR. (i.e. Each automobile in competition shall be the subject of a log book in accordance with Schedule L).

8. DOCUMENTATION

Documentation **MUST** be completed and lodged prior to the Event.

- Current Motorsport Australia Licence
- Current Motorsport Australia Affiliated Club Membership
- Motorsport Australia Log book and Certificate of Description if issued
- Proof of Registration for Road Registered Vehicles
- Motorsport Australia Self Scrutiny Form
- Motorsport Australia Statement of Vehicle Compliance

9. SCRUTINY

Self Scrutiny documentation **MUST** be completed prior to the Event. Targeted scrutiny audits may be completed at the Event. Safety helmets as specified in Schedule D (refer "General Requirements for Cars and Drivers") must be worn by drivers whenever on the circuit; (ii) goggles or visors (which must not be fitted with glass lenses) must be worn in all open cars and in closed cars to which no windscreen is fitted.

Drivers' clothing as per Schedule D of the Motorsport Australia Manual and may be required to be presented to the scrutineers for inspection. Clothing must extend from ankles to neck to wrists. Clothing and footwear of flammable synthetic material, such as nylon, is not acceptable.

10. JUDGES OF FACT

- The following are deemed to be Judges of Fact:
- Starter (Paul Bonnett) - Start procedure.
- Chief Timekeeper (Katrina Steggles) – Results
- Clerk of the Course, Course Officials (Chris Frith, Geoff Barnett, Andrew Koops, Brian Agars, Katrina Barnett – Failure to follow course.
- Chief Scrutineer, Clerk of the Course (Chris Frith, Alan Pickstock) – Eligibility

11. BRIEFINGS

Each Driver must review the Drivers' Briefing Notes which will be sent out prior to the Event. Entry to the Event constitutes acceptance of these briefing notes. On the day, a drivers briefing will be conducted via loud speaker. See item 26 – Timetable. Attendance is compulsory and where drivers fail to **SIGN ON** and be present for the duration of the Drivers' Briefing, a penalty shall be applied by the Stewards as per the NCR. The penalty may be varied by the Stewards of the Event in exceptional circumstances.

12. FUEL

Is not available on the property. Refuelling of vehicles may be carried out in the paddock with the engine turned off. An observer with a working fire extinguisher must be present. Fuel must comply with Schedule G of the Motorsport Australia Manual.

NOTE: SMOKING IN THE MAIN PADDOCK AREA IS PROHIBITED.

13. RAISING OF VEHICLES

Vehicles may be raised using appropriate equipment to change wheels in the paddock. For any task that requires a person to work under a vehicle, it must be jacked up on a hard surface such as the burn out pad. Non-compressible safety stands must be in place before a person reaches under or works under the vehicle.

14. CONDUCT OF THIS EVENT

Gates to the venue will open at **9.00am on Friday 13th October** to allow competitors to set up. For security purposes, officials will be on site overnight.

Track familiarisation and private practice will run from **11.00am to 4pm**.

One competitor at a time will be allowed on the track and competitors may make as many runs as track congestion allows.

There will be no official timing for track familiarisation and practice.

Competition will be run on Saturday 12th and Sunday 13th of October.

15. CONDUCT OF COMPETITION

There will be a minimum of two (2) official runs (weather permitting)

As will be explained at the Drivers' Briefing, vehicles will form up in running sheet order.

At the start line there are three lights.

When you arrive at the start position, move slowly forward until the YELLOW light comes on. Roll back until the YELLOW light goes out. The starter will then place a chock under a wheel.

Start your run as soon as practicable after the GREEN light comes on.

If the RED light comes on, do not proceed.

Competitors should familiarise themselves with the array of start lights.

At the completion of a run, the vehicle must return slowly (10KPH maximum) to the paddock via the return road unless permission is given by the Clerk of the Course to return on the track proper.

If a red flag / light is shown during a run, the vehicle must abort the run and proceed slowly to the finish. In this case, a re-run will be allowed, unless the vehicle caused the red flag incident. **The Use and Positions for the Red Flags will be detailed at the Drivers Briefing.**

Hitting a track marker or having two or more wheels outside the white line, will be deemed to be exceeding track limits and this will result in the run being discounted. Markers will be designated at the driver's briefing and competitors should familiarise themselves with the markers. All course officials are deemed to be Judges of Fact in this regard.

16. TYRE WARMING

Each driver is entitled to one tyre warming sequence in a forward direction for the purpose of warming tyres prior to each timed run but must be ready to run as soon as the start is clear. Warm up vehicle will be released by green light being illuminated after the vehicle on start line leaves the start line. If there is a delay at the start line which is not the fault of the driver, another tyre warming on the track proper will be permitted. The tyre warming must be conducted only on the portion of the course designated by the organisers, but this will not be more than a distance of 50 metres.

The use of any device to artificially heat tyres and/or wheels is forbidden.

17. RUNNING ORDER

The running order will follow as closely as possible the order listed in the Official Running Sheet. As far as possible classes will be grouped for each timed run. In the case of multiple entered vehicles, the running order will be managed to ensure that each run or re-run for a particular vehicle is separated by a period of not less than five minutes, irrespective of which driver is in the vehicle.

18. RE-RUNS

Re-runs will only be permitted under the following circumstances:

- failure of timing equipment.
- the signal to start having been given when the course was not clear.
- if for any reason the rear wheels of the vehicle fail to reach the start line, or
- if the Clerk of the Course declares that the track has become unsafe during a run.

Re-runs will be taken as soon as possible after the Clerk of the Course determines that a re-run is necessary. The rerun will be at least five minutes after that vehicle's previous run.

19. DAMAGE TO INFRASTRUCTURE AND EQUIPMENT

Any damage to the Infrastructure and/or equipment both portable and/or fixed (including replenishment of Medical Supplies and Fire Extinguishers) at Collingrove Hill Climb by a competitor and or their vehicle will become the financial responsibility of the said competitor and the Organisers reserve the right to claim the cost of the repair or replacement from the competitor where negligence is shown.

20. ANIMALS

No animals other than registered companion and guide (sight & hearing) dogs are allowed in the paddock while competition is taking place. All animals must be restrained on a lead. Any exception can only be authorised by the Clerk of the Course.

21. WASTE LIQUIDS

Oil or other waste must not be disposed of on site.

PLEASE LEAVE THE AREA CLEAN AND TIDY.

22. AWARDS

1st, 2nd and 3rd place trophies will be awarded for the fastest times of the Event. The first placegetter will be declared **THE MOTORSPORT AUSTRALIA SCCSA 2024 SOUTH AUSTRALIAN HILLCLIMB CHAMPION.**

1st, 2nd and 3rd place trophies will be awarded for all classes for which there are six or more entrants. 1st and 2nd place trophies will be awarded for all classes where there are four or five entrants. A 1st place trophy will be awarded for all classes where there are three or fewer entrants.

Any entrant who breaks a class record will receive recognition. If an outright track record is broken, the entrant will receive \$1000.00. The track record is currently 27.25 as set in 2014.

The fastest competitors will be awarded the following minimum prize money:-

1st -\$500.00 2nd-\$300.00 3rd-\$150

The following fastest trophies will also be awarded:

- Sports Sedan
- Sports Car (2A, 2C, 6SR, Prototypes)
- Production Sports (2B, 2F)
- Historic Group N
- Historic Vehicle
- Fastest 4WD Tin Top
- Fastest 2WD Tin Top
- Road Registered Clubman

23. PARADES, MEETING RIDES, DEMONSTRATIONS.

This Event **may** include a Parade and Demonstrations in accordance with the NCR.

Any Parade or Demonstration will be conducted at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course.

Minimum Passenger age is 12 years of age as at last birthday.

This Event **may** include a Motor Sport Passenger Ride Activity (MSPRA) which shall be run under and in accordance with the Motorsport Australia MSPRA Policy.

Any decision regarding parades or passenger ride activities will be made by the Clerk of Course on the day ensuring all COVID restrictions are adhered to.

24. SMOKING

Smoking (which includes e-cigarettes and “vaping”) and any naked flame is prohibited within 3 metres of any refuelling/defueling operation”).

INTEGRITY, ALCOHOL, DRUGS AND OTHER SUBSTANCES

Motorsport Australia’s National Integrity Framework and any associated policy (including the Australian Anti-Doping Policy, Motorsport Australia Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy, the Motorsport Australia Alcohol Policy, apply to any activity authorised by Motorsport Australia as published at motorsport.org.au.

Any participant including the holder of a Motorsport Australia Licence (or a Licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of alcohol, any drug or other banned substance. In addition to any penalty imposed by Motorsport Australia, a further penalty/s may be applied by Sport Integrity Australia.

Consumption of alcohol in any Reserved Area, is prohibited until all Competition is concluded each day.

25. VISION RECORDING EQUIPMENT

Cameras on vehicles cannot be used unless prior permission is received from the chief scrutineer and checked for secure mounting. In all cases there must be a minimum of a secondary restraint system installed which must be able to Pre-event the camera falling off if the primary restraint system fails. Where cameras are used, competitors will make recordings available to the Officials and the Organisers if requested to do so.

Other Photography is restricted to Public Areas with the exception of Accredited Media.

No aerial photography by “drone” or other similar device is permitted unless the User can present to the Clerk of the Course evidence of authorisation issued by Motorsport Australia. Live streaming is prohibited at any time that the vehicle is on the racing surface.

26. THE SHOOTOUT

At the end of the Event, 12 entrants will be invited from the following groups: - Open wheeled cars, All wheel drive cars, and RWD/FWD cars to compete in the **Shootout**. A minimum of 3 vehicles from each group will be required for that group to participate in the **Shootout**.

All shootout participants are required to display the shootout sponsor’s logo on their vehicle.

Any times recorded in the shootout will NOT be included in results for **THE MOTORSPORT AUSTRALIA SCCSA 2024 SOUTH AUSTRALIAN HILLCLIMB CHAMPIONSHIP** or count towards Collingrove Hill Climb track records.

Hitting a track marker will result in the run being discounted.

The winner from each group will be determined by comparison of the Shootout time with the best time recorded by the entrant during the MOTORSPORT AUSTRALIA SCCSA 2023 SOUTH AUSTRALIAN HILLCLIMB CHAMPIONSHIP.

Formula for determining Shootout results.

Shootout time divided by the best time recorded in the Championship multiplied by 100 to express the result as a percentage.

Example:- Entrant X –championship best time 37.21 seconds –shootout time 38.34 seconds $38.34 / 37.21 \times 100 = 103.0368\%$

The entrant with the lowest percentage is the winner and will be acknowledged.

27. RESOLUTION OF JUDICIAL MATTERS.

Competitors are required to remain at the venue for 30 minutes after the last run to allow any judicial matters to be resolved.

28. ABANDONMENT, POSTPONEMENT & CANCELLATION

The Organiser reserves the right to abandon, postpone or stop the Event in accordance with the NCR

29. PROTESTS

Any protests must be lodged in accordance with the NCR.
